
Payson City Vote By Mail 2023 Elections



WHY CONDUCT A VOTE BY MAIL ELECTION?

Vote By Mail is an effort to get more residents involved in making important decisions.

Vote By Mail removes many of the inconveniences of Election Day such as standing in long lines or leaving work. Voters complete ballots in the comfort of their own home with candidate information easily accessible so voters can make an informed decision when casting their ballot.

WHEN WILL I GET MY BALLOT?



Every eligible voter will receive a ballot by mail. Ballots are mailed approximately 21 days before an election. Ballots cannot be forwarded by the post office, so visit vote.utah.gov to check/update your voter information. If you have further questions, contact the Utah County Elections Office at 801-851-8128.

WHAT IF I DID NOT RECEIVE A BALLOT?

If you don't receive a ballot in the mail, you will need to request one from the Utah County Elections Office. If you have not received a ballot by election day, go to one of the Voting Assistance Centers and you can vote provisionally by presenting valid identification and proof of residency. WHAT ABOUT VOTER PRIVACY?

Your ballot remains sealed while your signature is verified by trained election workers. The signature stub is then removed. Next, a second team of election workers opens the envelope, removes the ballot, and feeds it into the optical counting machine to record your vote.

HOW DO I SUBMIT MY BALLOT?

Please use the ballot that is mailed to you. The cost of postage is covered so you don't need a stamp. After completing your ballot, just put it in the provided envelope, sign in the appropriate space, seal and mail it. Mailed ballots <u>MUST</u> be postmarked the day before the election, November 20.

You may also drop your ballot in the secure Curbside Dropbox on the north side of the Payson City Center, 439 W Utah Avenue OR in any secure <u>Utah County Curbside Dropbox</u>.

Delivered ballots must be delivered in person to a Voting Assistance Center on Election Day, November 21.

WHAT IF I WANT TO VOTE IN PERSON?

On Election Day, **November 21**, Voting Assistance Centers will be provided throughout Utah County to address voter concerns, issues, and receive help. Please bring your mailed ballot with you. If you do not bring your ballot, you will be required to vote provisionally so that election officials can verify that your mailed ballot was not already submitted. <u>Voter Assistance Centers</u>

WHAT ABOUT VOTER FRAUD?

While there is a chance of voter fraud in every election regardless of casting method, studies show that vote by mail is safe and secure. A team of trained election workers will make sure your signature matches your official voter registration signature on record with Utah County and other official documents.
