In observance of Presidents Day, Payson City offices will be closed Monday, February 15th.

If your garbage pick up day falls on Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday your garbage pickup will be delayed by one day. Thursday pickup will remain the same.

Payson City is excited to offer free Wi-Fi to our residents and visitors at several of our City parks and Payson City Facilities. This will allow people to utilize the free Wi-Fi and stay connected to work, family and/or friends while enjoying events, baseball and soccer games, etc. while at Payson City Parks and Facilities.

Federal CARES Act funding was used to fund Public Wi-Fi at Memorial Park, Peteetneet Museum, Payson City Pool, McMullin Park and Hillman Ballfields. Internet access will be available during regular park or facility hours. Internet access is provided by Payson City in conjunction with UTOPIA Fiber, who will be managing the system.

Offering free Wi-Fi at Payson City facilities and parks advances Payson City's goals of keeping technology and innovation at the forefront of everything the City does. Especially during the pandemic, some have not had access to the internet so the City is excited to help provide a way for all residents to stay connected, job search, research, complete assignments, etc.

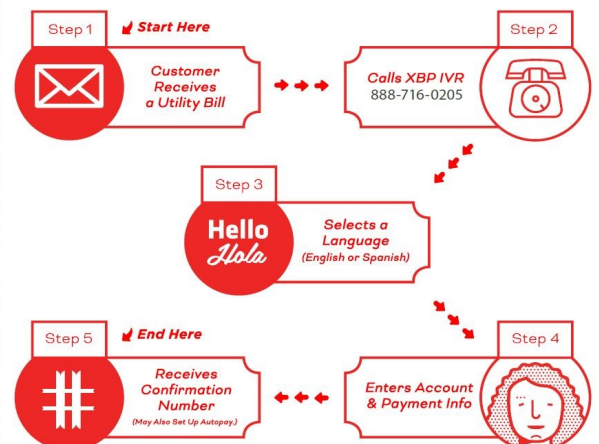
