Utility Rate Increase

Payson City will be increasing utility rates effective July 1, 2022. The Payson City Council held a public hearing on June 15, 2022 to discuss the utility rates. Inflation in the United States has been averaging 7% with Utah being over 10%. To keep up with the rising costs of doing business, the utility rates for Power, Storm Drain, Solid Waste & Recycling will increase by 7%. The culinary water rates will increase by 17% to allow needed infrastructure projects to be completed in the next two years. The Pressurized Irrigation rates will not be increased as this is the first year with meters. The State of Utah is mandating an upgrade to the wastewater treatment plant to remove certain nutrients from the wastewater. The rates will be increased by 35% handle the rising costs to treat our wastewater. The City Council has tried hard to limit utility rate increases over the years but feel that the rate increases are needed to keep the utilities viable for the future needs of the city.

Spring Lake Animals

Many of you have probably visited our beautiful Spring Lake. Over the years, many domesticated pet animals, in particular ducks and geese, have been abandoned here. This summer, the City will be adding new educational signs at Spring Lake. The signs will educate visitors about the dangers of feeding bread to waterfowl, both for their health and the water quality. We know many of you enjoy feeding the waterfowl at Spring Lake, so the signs will also include alternative things to feed such as; oats, cooked



rice, duck or chicken food, and even corn. Domestic pet animals, such as ducks, geese, and rabbits, are not quipped to survive at parks or in nature and wreak havoc on wildlife populations, water quality and natural areas.

We hope these signs encourage positive changes and help maintain our parks beauty and health. If you have questions,

Illegally parked vehicles are subject to citation by Payson police including, but not limited to the following situations:

Parking for 72 hours or more in the same spot, parking in a fire lane, blocking driveway, parking in a disabled parking spot without a disabled placard, double parking, parking on the street with expired registration, parking in front of a fire hydrant, parking on the wrong side of the road, obstructing snow removal, parking in a no parking zone, obstructing traffic, parking within 20 feet of crosswalk, parking within 30 feet of stop sign, parking within intersection. See Title 8 Traffic Regulations Payson City Code.

Disabled Parking violation is a \$100 fine if paid within 14 days of receiving the ticket; \$200 for the second offense; \$300 for the third offense.

All other violations: \$25.00 if paid within 14 days of receiving the ticket; \$50 for a second offense; \$100 for the third offense.

Failure to pay three (3) or more tickets may result in the towing of the vehicle.

Utility Payments

Utility Bill payments are due on **July 28th** (the last <u>business</u> day of the month). If you haven't yet paid your past due bill, please take care of it by **July 20th** to avoid shut off and an additional service fee.

Payments made after 5:00 p.m. will be credited on the next business day.
