Pressurized Irrigation Fees

The pressurized irrigation system was energized May 2nd. If everyone limits their watering for the next few weeks, the water coming out of the canyon should be sufficient until Strawberry Highline turns water into the canal. Please continue to follow the 3-day a week watering schedule: odd numbered addresses water Monday, Wednesday and Friday and even numbered addresses water Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday. Watering is not permitted between the hours of 10:00 am and 6:00 pm and no watering on Sundays to allow the system to recharge.

The City Council has approved the following increase in the pressurized irrigation fees to go into effect on April 1, 2022:

The base rate is \$19.00 per month (billed all 12 months)

The water usage rate is calculated on a 3-Tier Rate Structure:

- \Box Tier 1 0 to 50,000 gallons of usage billed at \$0.60 per 1,000 gallons
- \Box Tier 2 50,001 to 90,000 gallons of usage billed at \$.75 per 1,000 gallons
- ☐ Tier 3 90,001 gallons and up of usage billed at \$1.00 per 1,000 gallons

With the new rates, your water bill will go up during the irrigation season, but will go down during the non-irrigation months due to the lower base rate. Your yearly PI bill should be about the same if you are conservative and monitor your usage on the Sensus Customer Portal. Go to our website paysonutah.org under the water department for instructions on how to sign in to the customer portal. For information on ways to conserve water visit conservewater.utah.gov.
