Snow Removal Guide

Payson City Street Department strives to maintain adequate snow removal for driving conditions. The following information will help residents better understand what to expect during the winter months for snow removal. The City has established the following priorities for snow removal based on street classification and usage:



Priority 1: All Main Arterial and Collector Streets
Priority 2: Arterial and Collector Roads Leading to or from School Zones.
Priority 3: Secondary and Residential Streets.
Priority 4: Cul-de-sacs, Roads with No Outlets.

- SR 198 (100 N & 100 W to City Boundary)
- 800 S from SR 198 to I-15
- Main Street from 100 N to I-15



MAYOR'S MESSAGE



I hope all of you had a wonderful Christmas with friends and family and enjoyed a fun and safe New Year celebration. I wish all of you the very best in 2023.

During 2022, there were many changes in Payson. Here are a few:

• Mountainland's Technical College (MTECH) Payson campus was funded by the Utah State Legislature. MTECH received funding to build the first building on the 13.5-acre Payson campus and will break ground on the approximately 86,000-square-foot building in April or May 2023.

• The Red Bridge Development to be built around the MTECH Payson campus continues to make progress.

• Several new businesses came to Payson: Big O Tires, Sherwin-Williams, Dutch Brothers Coffee, ERA Brokers Consolidated, Better Bowls, Riley's Taste of Sunshine, and Popeye' Chicken. Several existing businesses made or plan to make changes: Eli's Ice Cream is under new ownership, Papa Murphy's and Sip N Spot moved to new locations, and America First Credit Union is building a new branch office off of Turf Farm Rd. Jones Paint and Glass is planning to build a retail store and a new manufacturing facility in Payson soon.

Here is a sample of the retail growth we are experiencing. We are excited to welcome these businesses and look forward to additional retail development in our community.

Payson has a rich and extensive equestrian connection. I have been working to bring the connection back into focus for the past five years. Utah Valley University (UVU) purchased 38.9 acres in Payson to build a future satellite campus. They have a rodeo program that needs a home, I have let President Tuminez and her staff know that we would love to be that home.

On November 5, 2022, at the Cowboy Re-ride Reunion, during the Wilderness Circuit Finals, Governor Cox officially declared November 5th as Rodeo Pioneer Day. He honored two past Payson City residents: Raymond Knight and Earl Bascom. They are Champion Rodeo Cowboys and International Contributors to the sport of rodeo. Earl Bascom is known as the "Father of Modern Rodeo: and Raymond Knight, who coined the word "Stampede," is known as the "Father of Canadian Stampede." Both men have too many rodeo accomplishments to detail in this article.

I believe this is the right time, and Payson is the right place to establish an Equestrian Park that will provide high school, collegiate, and professional cowboys and cowgirls a place to practice and compete in rodeo events. I am excited about the possibility of reconnecting with our equestrian roots.
