Snow Removal Guide

Payson City Street Department strives to maintain adequate snow removal for driving conditions. The following information will help residents better understand what to expect during the winter months for snow removal. The City has established the following priorities for snow removal based on street classification and usage:

Priority 1: All Main Arterial and Collector Streets
Priority 2: Arterial and Collector Roads Leading
to or from School Zones.

Priority 3: Secondary and Residential Streets.
Priority 4: Cul-de-sacs, Roads with No Outlets.

State Roads within Payson City Limits Maintained by UDOT

- SR 198 (100 N & 100 W to City Boundary)
- 800 S from SR 198 to I-15
- Main Street from 100 N to I-15



MAYOR'S MESSAGE

January has come and gone. It doesn't seem possible that we are well into February. Before we know it, we will be into March.

As all of you know, we have been in a drought for many years.

This winter, however, is changing that pattern. We haven't had a winter like this for many years. People are comparing it to the winter of 1982-83.

Although we are thankful for the moisture, hopefully, we won't experience flooding as we had during the Spring of 1983.

We are hovering around 200 percent of normal and are hoping for a spring season that includes a gradual warming trend. But if it warms up too fast, we must and will be prepared.

We plan to do an extensive cleaning of Dry Creek, which handles most of the runoff from Payson Canyon. We will also clean Peteetneet Creek to handle runoff water as efficiently as possible.

As in the past, we will work closely with Strawberry Water and Utah County to keep the creek running out of Payson Canyon clear of obstruction, including the log catch pond area just North of the Payson Canyon Park (Beer Can Flats.)

We will also work with the Highline Canal, exploring the possible use of the canal system, if necessary, to temporarily reduce water flow down Dry Creek and Peteetneet Creek.

As we plan these preventive measures, we will need your help to clean Dry Creek and other potential water choke point areas in our city. We will also need your help filling sandbags to stockpile just in case they are needed.

As we monitor the runoff potential, we will keep you informed and schedule the necessary activities to be prepared well in advance.

There is no need to be alarmed. The steps I have outlined are precautionary but are necessary to preplan our response. If mother nature decides not to cooperate with our wish for a

gradually warming spring, we will be ready!

I am confident our citizens of Payson will respond when we call for volunteers to help with these preventive measures.

I have seen you in action many times as a police officer and recently as Mayor of Payson City. We have a great community that I am proud of, and it is an honor to be your Mayor!
