## A BETTER WAY TO WASH YOUR CAR

## Why Does It Matter?

Polluted water that enters your storm drain (the grate in the street curb that collects water runoff) does not get treated, and instead flows directly into local water bodies where it can harm aquatic life and habitats, contaminate drinking water supplies and recreational waterways, and lesson aesthetic value. Here are some tips to help keep things CLEANER:

- Use a commercial car wash facility whenever possible. Their water is recycled or treated before discharged to the sanitary sewer system.
- If using a commercial facility is not possible, wash the car on gravel, grass, or other areas able to absorb the wash water.
- ✓ Use specialty cleaning solutions sparingly.
- Try to minimize water usage by using nozzles and/or buckets.
- Turn off the hose when not in use.
- ✓ Use a low pressure hose. A high pressure hose removes more pollutants.
- ✓ When cleaning the car interior, properly disposed or recycle any trash.
- Try using detergents and soaps that say "biodegradable" or "phosphate free."

## Payson City Utility Rate Increase

The Payson City Council held a public hearing on June 21, 2023, to discuss utility rates. Inflation in the United States has been averaging 6%. To keep up with the rising costs of doing business, the City Council approved the following utility rates increases effective July 1, 2023. The utility rates for water, sewer, pressurized irrigation, and storm drain will increase by 6%. The rates for solid waste will remain the same. Republic Services, who provides our recycling service, is raising their rates so recycling will increase from \$8.71 to \$10.00 per month. Payson City's cost for purchasing power has increased significantly over the past year. To cover the higher costs, power rates will increase 10%. The City Council has tried hard to limit utility rate increases, but they feel that the rate increases are needed to keep the utilities viable for the future needs of the city. Happy Independence Day from your friends in the Payson City Legal Department. As we gather this month to celebrate Independence Day and Pioneer, if you choose to celebrate with fireworks, please keep the following tips and restrictions in mind to keep yourself, your family, and your fellow Payson Citizens safe.

- 1. Discharge fireworks only in approved areas.
- 2. Supervise children discharging fireworks.

3. Never discharge fireworks while impaired by drugs or alcohol.

- 4. Never point fireworks at another person.
- 5. Keep a bucket of water nearby.
- 6. Soak both sides of spent and unused fireworks for a few hours before discarding.
- 7. Never use illegal fireworks.

### Dates and Times Fireworks may be discharged

A person may discharge fireworks for Pioneer Day beginning on July 22 and ending on July 25. Discharge times are between 11:00am and 11:00pm during the discharge period except for July 24th when the hours are extended to midnight. A person is guilty of an infraction and punishable by up to a \$1000 fine for discharging fireworks outside the legal discharge date and times. Utah Code Ann. 53-7-225. An individual who negligently, recklessly, or intentionally cause or spreads a fire through the discharge of fireworks is liable for the cost of suppressing that fire and any damages the fire causes. Utah Code Ann. 53-7-225.1.
