Applications must be submitted online no later than 5:00 p.m. on March 18, 2024.


Payson City Spring Clean Up March 30th - April 6th



MAYOR'S MESSAGE

Hello Citizens of Payson,

It is time for another Mayor's Message.

Last month my message explained what is happening on Historic Payson Main Street and why. I hope my message helped answer your questions. If not, please contact me and I would be happy to talk to you.

The utilities beneath Main Street (mostly the water pipes) are in such bad condition that some of them break as the dirt is removed from on top of them. This has resulted in water outages for the downtown businesses. Working with the Red Pine Construction employees our water department has been able to restore water service in a timely manner. The business owners have been very patient with our efforts to minimize the impact of these water outages. We are very thankful for their understanding and support.

There are two events planned this month that I would like to make you aware of.

The first event is the annual Helping Hands Dinner. The members of the Mayor's Interfaith Council organize it. Pastor Kent Boykin of the Hope Baptist Church is the Council Chairman, and the other councilmembers are from the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints. As the Mayor of Payson, I am also a member of the Interfaith Council. Except for the Covid-19 years this has become an annual event.

This year the Helping Hands Dinner will be on Friday March 22, 2024, at 6:00 pm, in the banquet hall at the Payson City Center located at 439 W Utah Avenue. Admission to the dinner is a \$5.00 donation per person or \$25.00 donation per family. We encourage attendees to bring any kind of dessert (pies, cakes, cookies, etc.) to be auctioned off during the dinner. One hundred percent of the donations and proceeds of the auction will be used to help anyone in need.

The Interfaith Council has helped many people in need with their city utility bills, medical prescriptions, medical bills, car repairs, etc. The Council has also helped with grade school programs to ensure students that need help will not go hungry during the weekend.

We would like to thank Payson Market, Smith's Food King, Wal-Mart, and Chubby's Café for their donations this year to the Helping Hands Dinner.

The second event is the 2nd Annual 2024 Payson Easter Sunrise Concert which will be Sunday, March 31, 2024, at the Peteetneet Auditorium from 6:30–7:30 am. Admission is FREE.

Sponsored by Payson City and the Mayor's Interfaith Council. It will feature The Hawthorne House Chorale, which is an interfaith chorale from Payson. Maestro Benjamin K. Winkler will be the Conductor. Come join us in celebrating Easter with performances of the world's greatest Easter Hymns and Choral Anthems.
