

Municipal General Election Day is Tuesday, November 21, 2023

The Payson City Municipal General Election will be conducted using Ranked Choice Voting. Please be aware of the following points.

1. Visit vote.utah.gov to ensure you are registered CANDIDATES RUNNING FOR ELECTION to vote, update voter information, and learn about the candidates running for office.

2. Visit the Payson City Website, City Recorder, Elections for election information and learn about the candidates running for office.

3. Voting Assistance Centers will be open on Election Day from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. for voter assistance and provisional voting. Payson City will have a Voting Assistance Center located at the Payson City Center, Banquet Hall, 439 W Utah Avenue.

4. Ballots will be mailed to registered voters around October 31st, which is 21 days before the General Election.

5. Simply complete the ballot and slip it in the return envelope. Ballots can be mailed (postage is prepaid), dropped in the secure curbside drop box on the north side of the Payson City Center, 439 W Utah Avenue, or dropped in any secure Utah County curbside drop box.

6. Mailed ballots must be postmarked by November 20th.

The Payson City Landfill will be available at no charge for the cleanup projects within the city limits. Please observe the following:

* Payson City will only accept discarded items that are collected from projects within the boundaries of Payson.

* Landfill fees will only be waived for Payson residents.

* Photo ID will be required to show proof of residency.

* Loads must be properly secured and covered to prevent the disposal of litter and debris on public and private property and to avoid penalties and fines.

* Hazardous waste, sealed containers of products, refrigerators and any kind of free liquid products will not be accepted.

Pressurized Irrigation

The Highline Canal, which supplies our Pressurized Irrigation (PI) water, ended their water season on Sept. 28th. With Spring Lake and Payson Lakes we hope to have PI water available for a couple more weeks into October. When the system is finally shut down it will take a couple of days for all the lines to drain. Please make sure you winterize your lines at that time and turn off all valves so you do not have a problem in the spring.

MAYOR'S MESSAGE

Citizens of Payson, Past Citizens, and Friends,

Many of you have questioned the recent rate increase. In July, power rates increased 10%; water, sewer, pressurized irrigation, and storm drain rates increased 6% and recycling almost 15%. As we have all experienced during the post pandemic economy, everything costs more than it did before due to inflation and other uncontrollable issues. That is no less true for operating a city.

With the closure of all the coal-fired power plants in Utah, it has been very difficult to find power to purchase. We have four generators in our power plant that used to run only during peak hours to supplement our power needs, but they now run 24 hours a day during the peak usage days. Last year, Payson's Power Department was buying power at more per kilowatt than we were charging residents. We subsidized more than a million dollars. That cannot be sustained and because of this, we had to raise power rates to cover costs.

Sewer rates have increased substantially over the past several years. In 2019 The State and Federal governments reduced the amount of nitrogen, ammonia, and phosphorus byproducts from the wastewater treatment process that can be outlet into Utah Lake. Our current sewer plant, already 20 years old, has to be upgraded to meet the new guidelines. Pre-pandemic, the cost was estimated at around \$25 million dollars. Currently, the cost is estimated at \$74 million. Payson City has bonded (taken out a loan) to construct the new sewer plant and lenders require a revenue stream large enough to cover the bond payment before the bond can be issued. Therefore, the sewer rates had to increase.

Republic services provides our recycling service. With the rising cost of fuel, Republic Services was charging Payson a fuel surcharge. This was not part of the recycling rate and again, Payson City was subsidizing the extra cost.

I know it is very difficult for everyone to make ends meet in this economy. The Payson City Council and staff are working hard to keep costs down and still provide excellent services to our residents.

Payson is a wonderful place to live and we appreciate you, our greatest resource.
