Pressurized Irrigation Notice

The pressurized irrigation water will be turned on during the first part of April.

To avoid flooding, make sure your main P.I. valve is turned off.

Please adhere to the following regulations:

- ♦ Residents with *even numbered addresses* water on *Monday, Wednesday & Friday* only.
- ♦ Residents with *odd numbered addresses* water on *Tuesday, Thursday, & Saturday* only.



Absolutely no watering on Sunday as this allows the system to recover.

- ♦ Shorten watering times to about 15 to 20 minutes.
- ♦ The most effective times to water are during the evenings and mornings when temperatures are cooler. Therefore, residents are asked to refrain from watering between 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.

Payson City and other larger water users will be scheduled to use the water during the daytime hours in order to reserve as much pressure as possible for the residents.

*Snowpack in Payson Canyon is only 39% of normal.
To ensure that we have enough water to last through the season,
Payson City will more strictly enforce the regulations than we have in the past.
