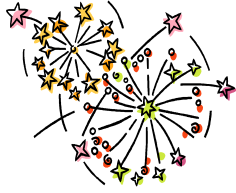

- Urgent Pressurized Irrigation Notice -

Due to the prolonged extreme drought conditions we have been experiencing, Payson City would ask that you please conserve as much water as possible. Our water supply is critically low this year. We would ask that you water only on the odd/even days according to your address and reduce watering times to 15 to 20 minutes per area or less if possible. We have a limited amount of water remaining in our supply sources and will run out before the end of the summer if we don't reduce the rate at which we are using the water. Please no watering on Sunday, as this allows the system to recover.

Thank you for working with Payson City in this effort. If we all work together, we can extend the water supplies to prolong our irrigation water through the remainder of the watering season. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

**Payson City does not allow a cross connection between
drinking water and irrigation water.**



It is against state law to cross connect without proper authorization.

**With the extreme drought situation, please do not cross connect
your drinking water connection to your sprinkling system.**

Culinary Water Base Rate Increase

Effective July 11, 2012, the culinary water base rate increased \$5.00 per month for each water utility customer. The rate increase is necessary to generate enough cash flow to pay the annual payment for the bond used to replace the damaged water tanks.
