Pressurized Irrigation Notice

Due to the drought conditions in the City of Payson and pursuant to section 10.10.2 of the Payson City Ordinances, the water superintendent is imposing the following watering restrictions effective immediately:

Please adhere to the following regulations:

All water users with odd numbered addresses shall water only on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday

All water users with even numbered addresses shall water only on Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

Absolutely no watering on Sunday as this allows the system to recover. Shorten watering times to about 15 to 20 minutes per station

Watering times are from midnight to 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. to midnight.

Payson City and other larger water users will be scheduled to use the water during the daytime hours in order to reserve as much pressure as possible for the residents.

To ensure that we have enough water to last through the season, Payson City will more strictly enforce the regulations first with a warning and then with a citation.

Penalties:

- **A first violation shall result in a warning to the user.**
- **The second violation shall be considered an infraction of the Payson City Water Ordinance and the user shall be fined \$25.00.**
- **The third and any subsequent violations shall be considered a Class C misdemeanor and shall require a mandatory appearance in the Payson Justice Court and may result in up to a \$750.00 fine and up to ninety (90) days in jail or both.**

Time to Update the Corridor Management Plan for the Mount Nebo Scenic Byway



Mount Nebo Scenic Byway (also known as the "Nebo Loop") provides access to a greatly cherished part of the Uinta-Wasatch-Cache National Forest that extends from Payson to Nephi and contains the tallest peak in the Wasatch Range. The Mount Nebo Scenic Byway is a favorite recreation spot for people offering a diverse range of recreational opportunities.

The Corridor Management Plan (CMP) outlines the goals, strategies and responsibilities for managing and preserving the Mount Nebo Scenic Byway. The last CMP for the Mount Nebo Scenic Byway was completed in 2003, and numerous recommended enhancements have since been completed. The purpose of this CMP Update is to evaluate current goals, promotional strategies, and recommend ways to improve safety for road users and enhance specific interpretive sites.

The Mount Nebo Planning Committee would like to understand what is important to the people that visit the Byway, and also hear from the gateway communities of Payson and Nephi that provide food, lodging, and other business to support Byway visitors. The public has several ways to contribute to the Mount Nebo Scenic Byway CMP Update. We will have mobile outreach booths at the **Payson Scottish Festival and the Nephi Ute Stampede Craft Show on Saturday, July 14th from 10am to 4pm.** We also have a project website where you can get more information and provide feedback on issues and potential future projects. www.mtneboscenicbyway.com.
