Payson City's Tentative Budget again includes making transfers in the 2012-2013 Fiscal Year from the following Utility Funds TO the General Fund, Vehicle Maintenance, and Information Technology. The purpose of such transfers is to help cover services that are provided for these utilities and for the citizens through the General Fund (Administrative Services, Community Development, Development Services, Public Safety, Streets, Parks, Swimming Pool, Youth and Senior Recreation, Library, and Cemetery). Also included is a transfer FROM the General Fund to the Golf Course (to cover Golf Course Expenditures):
