New Utility Shut-off Procedure

Payson City has implemented a new shut-off procedure for delinquent accounts. Under the old procedure, Payson City delivered a shut-off notice to pay the past due amount and the power was shut off the same day. To have the power turned back on, the customer would be required to pay the past due balance and a \$50.00 (\$75.00 after hours) fee.

Under the new procedure, Payson City will deliver a shut off notice giving the customer additional time as indicated on the shut-off notice to pay the past due amount. The customer will be charged a \$25.00 tag fee as adopted in the fee schedule for the delivery of the shut-off notice to the property. In the event the past due amount has not been paid within the time indicated on the shut-off notice, the customer's electric service and water (when possible) will be disconnected and a \$50.00 (\$75.00 after hours) service fee, as adopted in the fee schedule, will be assessed. These fees are services fees and will be assessed, whether or not the service is actually disconnected.

Utility Bill payments are due on **October 31st** (the last business day of the month). If you haven't yet paid your past due bill, please take care of it by October 25th to avoid shut off and an additional service fee. Payments made by 6:00 p.m. will be credited on the current business day.
