Snow Removal

In order to facilitate the speedy and safe removal of snow from city streets, please note the following in accordance with Payson City Ordinance 9.07.010: No parking is allowed on city streets between 10:30 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. from December 1st through March 1st. It is unlawful for any person to remove any snow or ice from any private property and place it on any public street, sidewalk, drive, or right-of-way. *property*.



*  Payson City and the Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) announced *
* that work has commenced on an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) to *
* study the I-15/Main Street interchange. This study will evaluate transportation conditions in the *
* area and recommend options that will meet current and future needs. *
* Initial work on the EIS, which will also include Main Street from I-15 to 100 North (SR-198), *
* recently began and is scheduled to be complete in two years. The study team is currently *
* working to gather preliminary information within the project area. A public meeting will be *
* scheduled in early 2015 to solicit input from the community as part of this preliminary phase of *
* the study. *
* The team will work with the public throughout the process to gather information and solicit *

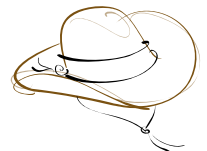

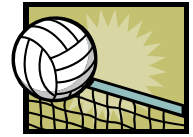
