Take Pride In Our Community City-wide Cleanup April 1st - April 30th

The Payson City Council has proclaimed the month of April as "Take Price in Our Community" month and are encouraging residents to participate in this Payson Pride Campaign by organizing and completing community and neighborhood cleanup projects

The Payson City Landfill will be available at no charge during the month of April for cleanup projects within the city limits. Individuals participating in the city-wide cleanup must observe the following:

- Payson City will only accept discarded items that are collected from projects within the boundaries of Payson.
- Landfill fees will only be waived for Payson residents or organized groups with preauthorization from Payson City. Be prepared to present proof of residence, such as a utility bill or photo ID.
- Organized groups must register with Payson City to receive landfill access. Please call (801) 465-5217 in advance.
- Loads mush be properly secured and covered to prevent the disposal of litter and debris on public and private property to avoid penalties and fines.
- Hazardous waste, sealed containers of products, refrigerators, and any time of free liquid products will not be accepted.
- ◆ Landfill hours: Monday Through Friday 8:00 am to 5:00 pm. Saturday 8:00 am to 7:00 pm closed
- Sunday.

Pressurized Irrigation Notice

The Pressurized Irrigation System will be energized on April 13, 2015. Please make sure that your sprinkling system is ready.

Due to the severe drought conditions in the City of Payson and pursuant to section 10.10.2 of the Payson City Ordinances, the water superintendent is imposing the following watering restrictions effective immediately:

All water users with odd numbered addresses shall water only on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday.

All water users with even numbered addresses shall water only on Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

There shall be NO watering on Sunday, as this allows the system to recover

Watering times are from midnight to 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. to midnight. Restrict watering times to 20 minutes or less per station or area.


Large water users, Churches, Schools and City parks will water during the day so that the residents will have sufficient pressure to water their properties during the designated times.


City employees will be enforcing the water restrictions with citations and or disconnection from the Pressurized Irrigation System.
