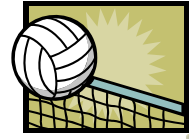

HELP WANTED: The Utah County Foster Grandparent Program is looking for seniors 55 or older, to serve as mentors, tutors, and care givers for children and youth within community organizations such as schools, hospitals, and youth centers. There they work with trained professionals to provide assistance, support, and knowledge to children and teens with special needs. Foster Grandparents receive a small stipend (about **\$200** per month), monthly training, and in some areas, mileage reimbursement or transportation to the volunteer facility. Volunteers must be income eligible (earn less than \$1915 per month for a single person and \$3102 for a married person), be willing to serve 15 or more hours per week and have the desire to help others. Snow Removal



In order to facilitate the speedy and safe removal of snow from city streets, please note the following in accordance with Payson City Ordinance 9.07.010: No parking is allowed on city streets between 10:30 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. from December 1st through March 1st. It is unlawful for any person to remove any snow or ice from any private property and place it on any public street, sidewalk, drive, or right-of-way. The Street Department Superintendent may issue a written permit to any person to move or pile snow or ice on a public street or right-of-way if the Superintendent determines it to be in the best interest of the City and residents of the area to do so (*this does not apply to the removal of snow from sidewalks fronting private property which the owner or occupant has the duty to clean, nor to access driveways from a public street to private property*).

Please Note: Property owners are responsible for removal of all snow and ice from sidewalks in order to prevent slipping. Additionally, property owners are responsible to remove snow and ice from the curb and gutter when the accumulation of snow and ice may result in the lack of free flow of water and could produce flooding of adjacent properties.
