

Sewer Rate Increase

After much deliberation and discussion, The Payson City Council, voted on June 17, 2015 to raise the sewer base rate from \$17.39 to \$32.39. The reasons for the rate increase are as follows:

- 1. The EPA and the Division of Water Quality for the State of Utah have required Payson City to upgrade the sewer treatment plant by 2020 to meet a very stringent phosphorus limit on the water that discharges into Beer Creek and then into Utah Lake. They are also requiring that nitrogen limits to be addressed within five years of the phosphorus limits. Payson City is currently having a study done to determine the necessary improvements to the sewer treatment plant to meet these limits. The estimated cost of the improvements will be somewhere between \$15 to \$17 million dollars. These upgrades have to be completed and working by 2020, which means that construction will have to start in 2018 and the design of the plant will have to be completed within the next 1 ½ years.
- 2. There are several capital improvement projects throughout the City that must be completed in the sewer lines and in the system to maintain the flow levels so that those living and working in the City do not have problems when they send water and waste to the sewer lines. These improvements will also cost several million dollars to complete and are necessary to ensure the continued use of the sewer lines.
- 3. Pursuant to Section 19-5-115 a violation of the new standards is subject to a civil penalty not to exceed \$10,000 per day per violation. If the violations are "willfully," "knowingly," or with "criminal negligence," the fine could be up to \$25,000 per day per violation.

Many other cities throughout the State of Utah are in the process of raising their sewer rates for these same reasons mentioned above.
