Pressurized Irrigation Notice

The Pressurized Irrigation System will be energized between April 15th & May 2nd. Please make sure that
your sprinkling system is ready. Pursuant to section 10.10.2 of the Payson City Ordinances, the City is im-
posing the following watering schedule:

All water users with odd numbered addresses shall water only on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday.

All water users with even numbered addresses shall water only on Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

There shall be NO watering on Sunday, as this allows the system to recover

Watering times are from midnight to 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. to midnight. Restrict watering times to 20
minutes or less per station or area. Large water users, Churches, Schools and City parks will water during
the day so that the residents will have sufficient pressure to water their properties during the designated
times.
