information. If you find you are not registered at
your current address or need to make changes to
your registration, click on the green “Register to Vote” button to
the right. Complete and/or update the required information.

The candidate filing period begins Thursday, June 1, 2017 and

regular office hours Monday – Thursday between 7:30 am and 6:00
