New Electric Rates

Payson City commissioned a Cost of Service Study for current electric rates. The study was completed December 2016 and the City Council adopted a new rate structure based on the recommendations of the study. The rate changes are revenue neutral for the City and will go into effect **March 1, 2017**.

The only change to the *Residential* rate is the reduction of the tiered rate levels from five to three; the first two levels will stay the same and the third level will be billed at \$0.12220/kWh. Distributed Generation (Net Meter) customers will be billed for all energy used at the residential rate and Payson City will buy all energy generated by the customer at \$0.07/kWh.

The *Commercial – No Demand* rate will change the most: the customer charge will be reduced from \$25.00 to \$13.00 and the tiered rate will be replaced with all kWh billed at \$0.0990/kWh. There will be minor changes to the *Commercial – Demand* rate, Industrial 1 rate and Industrial 2 rate.

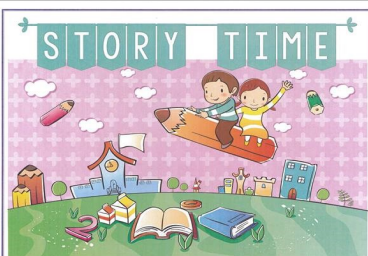
