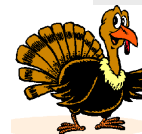

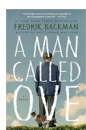


In observance of the Thanksgiving holiday, Payson City Offices will be closed Thursday, November 23rd.

### Payson Landfill punch passes

Beginning January 2018, the landfill punch pass for residents of Payson will no longer be issued. If you have not already picked up your pass for 2017, they are still available at the landfill and are good through the end of the year.

The City Council carefully considered this action. Among the factors considered was the amount of fraud that is taking place with duplication of the punch passes.

As a replacement for the discontinued punch pass, Payson City will have a week-long Spring & Fall cleanup when residents can take their debris to the landfill free of charge.

Residents can continue to take their green waste to the landfill at no charge. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding.

Remember, all loads must be covered or secured, covering the load is best. Attendants on duty will have the final say on whether or not loads are secure. Unsecured loads will be assessed a \$58 fine.

### REMINDER

It's that time of year when snow will soon be covering our streets!



As a reminder, in order to facilitate the speedy and safe removal of snow from city streets, it is unlawful for the owner or driver of any vehicle to park, cause to be parked, or allowed to be parked, said vehicle upon any city street or right-of-way of a city street between the **hours of 10:30 p.m. and 7:00 a.m.** each year from **December 1st, through March 1st**, of the following year.
