ELECTIONS 2017

General Election Day is November 7, 2017

Payson City will be conducting an all VOTE-BY-MAIL ELECTION this year. Following are a few important points to be aware of:

1. Visit VOTE.UTAH.GOV to ensure you are registered to vote, update voter information, and learn about the candidates running for office.
2. There will be no polling locations on the day of the General Election. There will be a voting center on November 7th at the Payson City banquet hall for provisional voting.
3. Ballots will be mailed to registered voters around October 17th, 21 days before the General Election.
4. Ballots will have pre-paid postage. You can simply put the completed ballots in your mailbox or return them to the Payson City offices.
5. Ballots need to be postmarked by **November 6th**.
