cause to be parked, or allowed to Payson City Landfill (6220 W. 10400 S.)


Please do not put trees in garbage cans!

## OVERDOSE PREVENTION TRAINING-M-M-

Utah County's Department of Drug and Alcohol Prevention and Treatment offers a FREE, one hour course that teaches participants how to prevent and respond to an opioid overdose.

#### Participants will learn:

- What an opioid is and how an overdose occurs
- How to respond to an overdose - The 5 R's
  - 1. Recognize Signs of an overdose
  - 2. React Call 9-1-1
  - 3. Reverse Administer Naloxone
  - 4. Respond Rescue Breathing/CPR
  - 5. Refer Stay until help arrives

- Risk Factors for an overdose
- How to administer Naloxone
- Overdose prevention tips
- Where to find local resources including:
  - Drug disposal boxes
  - Naloxone kits
  - Substance use and mental health treatment
