This partnership is called My Free Taxes, and can be accessed by going to myfreetaxes.com. This free service is available online 24/7, and customer support is available to answer questions through email, phone, or livechat.

By using this service to prepare their own taxes, community members can avoid the high cost of tax preparation fees during tax season. The average cost of a basic tax return through a paid preparer can range from \$200-500, so free tax preparation services can be a significant benefit for working families in our community.
