




Tickets for Payson Community Theater's production of "Once Upon a Mattress"


Are you registered to vote in Payson?

Rank Choice Voting

Rank Choice Voting (RCV) will be used for the first time in Payson Ranked choice voting City for the General Election on November 5, 2019 to elect three city council members. RCV is a method of voting that allows voters to rank multiple candidates for the same office in order of preference.

RCV can only be used to elect the offices City Council. It is not used in elections for the school board, county, state or federal offices. RCV combines the primary and general election into one event in November.

Using the RCV, votes are tabulated to determine winners. In order to be declared the winner of a race, a candidate must reach a threshold of 50 percent plus one of the total votes cast for the office.

The city will post additional information about RCV and elections on social media and the city's website. Don't forget to follow the city on Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram.

Payson City is now accepting PARC Tax Committee applications.

Payson City will be accepting applications for those interested in serving on the PARC Tax Committee starting August 1st.

To qualify for this volunteer position, you must be a Payson residents over the age of 18. There are three positions available for reappointment of current members or appointment of new members. These positions will serve until August 2021.
