TAX BULLETIN:

On November 6, 2018 Utah Voters approved Proposition 3, expanding Medicaid in Utah and raising the statewide sales tax rate from 4.7 to 4.85 percent starting April 1, 2019. As a result, the state combined sales tax rate will increase .15 percent in all Utah jurisdictions. Utah County Commissioners voted to enact a highways and public transit sales and use tax of .25 percent starting April 1, 2019. This changes the Payson City combined sales tax rate from 6.85% up to **7.25%**. The sales tax charged on electricity will also increase from 4.15% to **4.4%**.

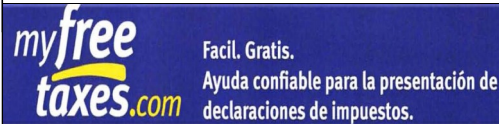

This partnership is called My Free Taxes, and can be accessed by going to myfreetaxes.com. This free service is available online 24/7, and customer support is available to answer questions through email, phone, or live chat.

By using this service to prepare their own taxes, community members can avoid the high cost of tax preparation fees during tax season. The average cost of a basic tax return through a paid preparer can range from \$200-500, so free tax preparation services can be a significant benefit for working families in our community.
