ELECTIONS 2019

Are you registered to vote in Payson?

To see if you are registered to vote in Payson at your current address, go to www.vote.utah.gov. Click on the “Register to vote or update registration” blue dot. Answer the questions and complete and/or update the required information.

Payson City will conduct elections this year for the following positions.

**Three (3) City Council Member Positions –
Four (4) year term each**

The candidate filing period begins Tuesday, August 13, 2019 and ends Tuesday, August 20, 2019. A Declaration of Candidacy Form or Nomination Petition must be filed in person with the Payson City Recorder, 439 West Utah Avenue, Payson, Utah between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. (UCA 20A-9-203 and UCA 10-3-301) The filing fee is \$50.



Rank Choice Voting

Rank Choice Voting (RCV) will be used for the first time in Payson City for the General Election on November 5, 2019 to elect three city council members. RCV is a method of voting that allows voters to rank multiple candidates for the same office in order of preference.

RCV can only be used to elect the offices of mayor and council. It is not used in elections for the school board, county, state or federal offices. RCV combines the primary and general election into one event in November.

Using the RCV, votes are tabulated to determine winners. In order to be declared the winner of a race, a candidate must reach a threshold of 50 percent plus one of the total votes cast for the office.

The city will post *additional* information about RCV and elections on social media *and the city's website*. Don't forget to follow the city on Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram.

Ranked choice voting allows you to rank your candidates in order of preference.

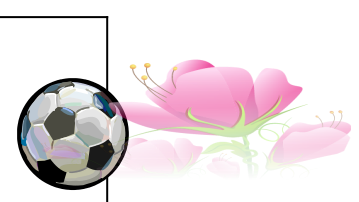

DID YOU KNOW???

All sheds and accessory structures require a building permit prior to placement. The fee is dependent upon the size. It is important to know the requirements for proper placement. Structures placed without a permit may be cited. Avoid the frustration of code enforcement - get a permit.



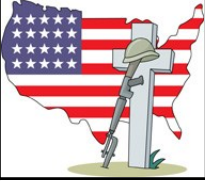
A fence permit is required before installing a new fence. There is no charge for the permit, but it is important to ensure you are in compliance with city ordinances. Also, be advised that some subdivisions have additional regulations about fencing.

Remodeling your home or finishing your basement requires a building permit to ensure building code requirements are met as well as for the safety of your family.

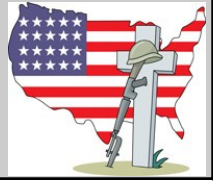
OPEN BURN REGULATIONS March 30 to May 30

This open burning allows residents to burn clippings, bushes, plants, and prunings from trees incident to property clean-up activities. PLEASE follow all guidelines given when applying for permit. Permits are free and can be obtained at: <http://air.utah.gov/OpenBurning/form/index.php>
