October is the opt-out period for recycling. To opt-out, you need to fill out the form included in your **October bill** and return it to the Payson City office **no later than October 31st**.

ELECTIONS 2019

General Election Day is **November 5, 2019**

Payson City will be conducting an all VOTE-BY-MAIL ELECTION this year as well as RANK CHOICE VOTING.

* Please be aware of the following points. Visit VOTE.UTAH.GOV to ensure you are registered to vote, update voter information, and learn about the candidates running for office.

* Visit PAYSONVOTES.COM OR UTAHRCV.COM to better understand Ranked Choice Voting and check the city's website for additional information.

* There will be no "polling location" on the day of the General Election. A **voting center** will be open on Election Day from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. at the Payson City Center, Banquet Hall, 439 W Utah Avenue, for voter assistance, provisional voting, and dropping off ballots.

* Ballots will be mailed to registered voters around October 15th, 21 days before the General Election.

* Ballots will have prepaid postage. Simply put the completed ballot in a mailbox or return it to the Payson City Center. There is a **new ballot drop box** on the north side of the city building at the drive through to deposit your ballot. It will be open during the three weeks prior to election day but not on election day. On election day, take ballots to the voting center in the Banquet Hall.

* Mailed ballots must be **postmarked** by November 4th.

FALL CLEAN UP

October 12th through October 19th

The Payson City Landfill will be available at no charge for the cleanup projects within the city limits. Please observe the following:

* Payson City will only accept discarded items that are collected from projects within the boundaries of Payson.

* Landfill fees will only be waived for Payson residents.

* Photo ID will be required to show proof of residency.

* Loads must be properly secured and covered to prevent the disposal of litter and debris on public and private property and to avoid penalties and fines.

* Hazardous waste, sealed containers of products, refrigerators and any kind of free liquid products will not be accepted.
