Stow before you go!

Secure all items in truck beds or trailers. Litter can easily be blown out of truck beds while driving. Larger items can endanger other drivers. Spilled fuel and oil from accidents can contaminate soils, groundwater, and surface waters.



Don't toss cigarette butts!

Cigarette filters are made of plastic and are a common source of plastic pollution that ends up in water bodies. Nicotine leached from cigarette butts can be toxic to fish and other aquatic life.

Check for and fix leaks ASAP!

Spills can introduce oil, fuels, coolant, and other fluids onto roadways, into storm drains, and out into our waterways. These fluids can harm wildlife and contaminate drinking water.

Keep tires properly inflated and clean!

Properly inflated tires prevent wear and tear, saving you money and keeping rubber particles out of streams and rivers. Wipe down wheel wells and rims to keep brake dust out of stormwater. Brake dust contains heavy metals, like lead, which can harm aquatic life and human health.
